






HELLO!


ABOUT US

Her students were so glad she participated and the boys loved watching her facial expressions as she tried to lead around a horse and pick up a duck.

MEET OLEN AND ARCHIE



Archie is a fun and spirited guy! He is often seen in costume, practicing karate moves, or inviting his entire preschool class to our house for a sleepover (without consulting us!). On Friday nights, we order pizza and get together with our closest friends. We rotate houses for hosting, all the kids run around, and we often stream the high school football or basketball game. We love cheering on local kids and unwinding at the end of the week. Once, it was such a nice night out, Brock decided to take advantage of the pleasant weather and set up a TV on our back deck. The kids were thrilled and we loved that we could watch the game and let the kids run themselves ragged!
