Who We Are

We are a multicultural family. Tony was born in India, his parents immigrating to Canada when he was a child. When Tony first brought Gina home and introduced her to his family, his mom cooked an amazing family dinner; preparing two versions of each dish. One, very spicy version, for Tony and the rest of his family; and the other, with less spice, just for Gina. Tony's mom wanted Gina to feel included during dinner, without it being too spicy for her. This simple, but inclusive act, set the tone for our relationship, with both cultures being not just accepted but equally considered and celebrated.

We feel strongly about doing what we can to help those in need. This summer, we took the kids to visit a Sea Turtle Rescue where they introduced us to injured turtles in various stages of rehabilitation. We learned this rescue was in need of funds so they can transport injured turtles via plane on short notice and pay for their emergency medical treatments. Tony is **passionate about giving back**. Last year, he participated in a very unique and rewarding medical mission in Africa. A company who is charged with caring for the health of the local wild rhino population hosted a safari. They load up a vehicle with medical supplies, veterinarians, and a few tourists that fund the mission and head out into the dense bush to locate the rhinos. During the physical exam, because he is an ophthalmologist, they tasked Tony with helping the medical team by applying medical drops to the Rhino's eyes so they stayed lubricated. Tony was not only thrilled, but humbled to have a part in caring for such a majestic animal. Your child will learn love of self through doing good deeds for others.



Gina has been a **stay at home mom** for the last three years. He wakes up early every Wednesday to make pancakes and take the kids to school. It's their favorite morning of the week! It was always our dream to have kids and be present.





When we pick the kids up from school, we ask the same three questions on the way home every day: What was your favorite part of the day? How were you kind or was someone kind to you? And, lastly, what mistake did you make and what did you learn from it? By asking these questions, the kids open up to us about what they have going on at school and whatever else happens to be on their minds. Recently, Rhys told us that he learned about the planet Mars at school. This led to a debate about the order of the planets, and whether they'd like to space travel or not when they're older. Later that evening, we watched a video about the planets together as a family. Your child will have meaningful, quality family time each and every day.
